Functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI): fMRI is a subtype of Magnetic Resonance Imaging that is commonly used in medicine to view the brain in action (2- or 3D images) in order to study its function. It measures the hemodynamic response (change in blood flow) related to neural activity in the brain.
