**Functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI)**: fMRI is a subtype of Magnetic Resonance imaging that is commonly used in medicine to view the brain in action (2- or 3D images) in order to understand its function and to detect disease. It measures more precisely the hemodynamic response (change in blood flow) related to neural activity in the brain.
